







## MONTH OF MARRIAGE

In 2011, the most popular month for marriages <u>was November with 15,693 (12.9%</u>) marriages, followed by <u>October with 15,391 (12.6%</u>) marriages. The month of June was the least popular month for marriages with only 5,889 (4.8%) marriages taking place in that month. The number of weekends in a month influences the number of weddings in that month, so this should be taken into consideration when interpreting these data.





The previous table 1.9 showed an increase of approximately 25,000 weddings in twenty years (2002 to 2011) for Commonwealth Marriage Celebrants. On 2002 numbers of celebrants, this increase would have represented <u>7 extra weddings</u> a year per celebrant.

However from 2002 to 2012 there has been approximately an <u>extra 8,000</u> Commonwealth Celebrants appointed. This represents only 2.5 extra weddings per year.

The Effect of the "Unlimited Market" approach has been to turn what was pre-2003 community service approach into a volunteer charity work, not the intended effect of strengthening professionalism as far as Remuneration for work is concerned.
